Constitution— Premier Grand Lodge

In the *Post Boy* of February 26th- 28th, 1722-3, there appeared the following advertisement:- *'This Day is publish'd*

‘THE CONSTITUTIONS OF THE FREEMASONS.

Containing the History, Charges, Regulations, etc., of that most Ancient and Right Worshipful Fraternity, for the Use of the Lodges. Dedicated to his Grace the Duke of Montagu the last Grand Master, by Order of his Grace the Duke of Wharton the Present Grand Master, authorized by the Grand Lodge of Masters And Wardens at the Quarterly Communications. Order'd to be Publish'd and recommended to the Brethren by the Grand Master And his Deputy. Printed in the year of Masonry 5723; of our Lord 1723. Sold by J. Senex and J. Hooke, both over against S. Dunstan's Church in Fleetstreet.

This work was the work that has ever since been known as Anderson's Constitutions of 1723.

About the author himself, Mr. James Anderson, or Dr. Anderson as he afterwards became, the industry of J.T. Thorp, Sir A. Robbins, J. Chetwode Crawley, and others, has brought together a great deal of information, but we still do not know the date of his birth. From the dedication he prefixed to a sermon printed in 1723, we learn that he was a citizen of Aberdeen, and the biographical note on him in the Catalogue of the Advocates Library, Edinburgh, of 1862, states that he was born there.

He was educated at the Marischal College, and would also appear to have been ordained in Aberdeen... Pierre

We owe a great debt to Dr. Anderson, author of the 1723 and 1738 Constitutions of the Premier Grand Lodge of England, for laying the firm foundations for Freemasonry we know today.

Modern Masonic historians cast some doubt on the accuracy of some of the matters reported by Dr. Anderson. It was Grand Master George Payne (1720-1721) a government official, who instructed Anderson to "digest" the old "Gothic constitution .. In a new and better method." He did as he was instructed and although we regard the 'History' as a fantasy, it is clear that Dr. Anderson and his contemporaries thought it was an accurate account of our origins.

There are some other matters where Dr. Anderson may have reported events inaccurately but it may be worthwhile to remember that by 1738 Anderson was in his early 80's. and may have suffered a few 'Senior Moments' as you and I do or will do.

Remember too that Dr. Andersons work was approved by members of the Grand Lodge before publication and in particular by Dr. Desaguliers who seems to be generally considered reliable.
